1 General safety information

These installation, operation and servicing instructions shall only be performed by qualified personnel.

The Efficient Dosing System (EDS) must be installed in accordance with all applicable electrical and plumbing standards. All washer extractor and dispenser power must be isolated during installation and/or any time the dispenser is maintained or serviced.

- · Always verify all voltage sources with a meter.
- Do not locate the pump-stand under plumbing fittings that could leak.
- Ensure that the installer has enough room to carry and lift the units when installing the EDS.
- Do not pick up unit by supply cord.
- Wear PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) when dispensing chemicals or other materials or when working in the vicinity of all chemicals, filling, or emptying equipment.
- Always observe safety and handling instructions of the chemical manufacturers.
- · You must follow all precautions as advised on the product safety data sheet.
- Always direct discharge away from you or other persons or into approved containers.
- Always dispense cleaners and chemicals in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- Always exercise caution when maintaining your equipment.
- Always re-assemble equipment according to instruction procedures. Be sure all components are firmly screwed or latched into position.
- Keep equipment clean to maintain proper operation.
- NOTE! This appliance is not be used by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction.

- NOTE! The Venturi/Pump-stand unit operates on 115VAC / 60 Hz, 220VAC / 60Hz, or 230VAC / 50 Hz. It also supplies low voltage power to the EDS controller and must only be supplied at Safety Extra Low Voltage (SELV).
- NOTE! This appliance must only be supplied at safety extra low voltage corresponding to the markings on the appliance.
- NOTE! It is a legal requirement, if the unit is supplied from the water mains, that a backflow device is installed offering protection equal or higher than the chemical class being used. This is to prevent back siphoning of non-potable substances into the water mains.


3 Introduction

The Efficient Dosing System (EDS) is capable of connecting and synchronizing directly to the washer extractor with Compass Control, Compass Pro or Clarus Control via a data cable. In Compass Control and Compass Pro any of the RS232 connections in the control system can be used. In Clarus Control the X10 connection on CPU card A1 can be used.

The EDS controller automatically adjusts the chemical dosage rate up or down based on the weight instruction from the washer extractor. This system will optimize the wash process, reduce chemical- and energy costs and deliver a total cost solution to the customer.

Up to 50 dosing formulas may be stored with the EDS controller.

The EDS controller receives a signal from the washer extractor at predetermined times in the wash program. Once a signal is received the EDS injects specific product(s) at that time in proportion to the weight of the linen as de-



The Venturi unit operates on 115VAC / 60 Hz, 220VAC / 60Hz, or 230VAC / 50 Hz. It also supplies low voltage power to the EDS controller.

Installation time and cost is significantly reduced with the computer based Formula editor program that allows an offsite technician to create sets of dosing formulas that are loaded onto the EDS controller via a standard USB stick. (16 GB or smaller). Summary reports can be created in Excel or HTML.



5 Installation

5.1 Requirements

- Verify that there is access to the appropriate power source for the unit.
- If the washer extractor has quick connections no external power source is needed for the pumps.
- The EDS system must not be installed near areas that suffer excess temperature changes, frost or precipitation of any kind.
- Ensure that the units can be mounted in an accessible position above the height of the required discharge location.
- The Venturi unit should be installed within 3 m of the washer extractor and close to product containers and at a
 convenient height for servicing, about 1–1.5 m. The input tubing from the chemical container to the Venturi should
 not be more than 2 m. The tubes must not be twisted and should hang freely without any sharp bends.
- The EDS controller must be mounted securely to a wall or on the washer extractor.
- The EDS controller can be mounted to a horizontal or vertical surface such as a wall or on the side panel on a washer extractor.
- The EDS system must not be used or installed in an ATEX environment.

5.2 Installation of the Venturi system


The wall where the pump-stand shall be mounted must support wall anchors and must be flat and perpendicular to the floor.

Use the wall mounting bracket as a template and mark the location of the holes on the wall.

Drill the holes and put in suitable wall anchors. Fasten the wall mounting bracket with the screws. Make sure the wall mounting bracket is in level.


Mount the Venturi unit on the wall mounting bracket and push down the clips to secure the unit. Secure the unit at the bottom with the remaining screw provided.

Connect the cable from the Venturi unit to the J1 port on the EDS controller.



Water connection


Connect the incoming water supply (A) to the Venturi pumps unit using the fittings provided. This will be a 3/4" Female BSP swivel. Ensure that the incoming water supply hose is supported so that it does not create unnecessary force on the inlet.



The water inlet pressure must be min. 26 psi/1.8 bar and max. 90 psi/6 bar.


The one way valve (C) must be installed to the main water pipe or at the tap to avoid risk of breaking at inlet (A). The hose (D) and adapter (E) are not included in the kit. They can be ordered as accessories or any extra required adapters which are field supplied can be used.

Connect the water outlet (B) to the washer extractor using the hose. Secure the hose to barb with a clamp. Hose sets used to connect the Venturi to the mains water supply must also be compliant with IEC61770.




Connection of the pickup tubes

Before connection, the Venturi pumps unit has to be opened. Use the screw driver to open the Venturi pumps unit.


The check valves (D) are supplied detached in a bag with the unit. To prevent damage, do not install hoses to the check valve while connected to the manifold.





Cut the hose to the length needed.

Push the hose (E) on to the check value (D) and secure with a cable tie. Connect the elbow (F) to the manifold and secure with the white clip (G).




Remove and drill a hole in each lid to the chemical containers to be used for the tubes to pass through. The hole shall be o 20 mm (3/4"). Use cable tie to fasten the suction pipe under the lids to prevent the suction pipes of floating or moving up from the containers.


Do not drill the hole when the lid is fastened to the chemical container.

Fasten each lid to the chemical containers again and insert the inlet tubes in the holes.




The washer extractor is prepared for connection of external dosing systems or water re-use systems etc. The connections may be closed at delivery.

• If the connections are closed at delivery, open the connections (A) that shall be used by drilling a ∞ 17 mm hole where the hoses shall be connected. Any extra required adapters which are field supplied can be used.



NOTE! Make sure there is no burrs left after drilling.

- Connect the hose from the right side of the Venturi pumps unit to the connection to be used on the washer extractor.
- Mount the rubber adapter, rubber bushing, clamps, hose from pumps unit to the connection (A) according to the following figure.
- Tighten clamps (B) with torque 3 Nm (2.2 lbf.ft).




If the hoses are made of a soft material such as silicone or similar, make sure the hose size isn't reduced, isn't sharp bended and is fitted properly to the washer extractor (A). Previous figure isn't valid for the soft hose. For WH6–6 model:

Note!

The washer extractor is prepared with nipple as below figure, connect the hose to the nipple at port (X) only

- Cut the top of the hose nipple (X) as showed in the figure.
- Connect the hose to the hose nipple (X).



NOTE!

Equipment for external dosing must only be connected to work on pump pressure and not on network pressure.

6 Installation of the EDS controller

6.1 General


The EDS controller can be mounted on a wall or on the side panel on a washer extractor.

Connect the cables on the back of the EDS controller. Mount the mounting plate on its location and mount the EDS controller on the mounting plate.


The mounting plate is mounted with the self-adhesive Velcro hooks or with the nuts and Allen bolts (enclosed with the kit). The self-adhesive Velcro hooks shall be used if the EDS controller is to be mounted on a washer extractor.

6.2 Installation on Compass Control and Compass Pro

- Connect the power supply cable to the machine (A) and the other end of the cable together with the cable from Efficient Dosing in a connection box or with plug and receptacle.
- Connect one end of the cable to the EDS controller J2 and the other end to the machine (B).



If the machine IS NOT prepared for external dosing systems from factory the cable from the J2 port on the EDS controller shall be connected to the RS232 port on one of the I/O modules in the machine. Follow the instruction for your type of machine.




Connection to I/O module type 2

Disconnect the power to the machine.


Demount the cover panel at the back of the machine.

Remove one of the covers to the holes on the back of the machine. The location is different on different models. The cable from the J2 port on the EDS controller shall then be run through the hole (A) and connected to the RS232 port on the I/O module.

Insert the cable and mount with the counter nut and cable gland according to the figure.



Connect the cable from the J2 port on the EDS controller to the RS232 port on the I/O module. Strap the cable at suitable positions.




Connection to I/O module type 1, 11 or 3

Disconnect the power to the machine.


Remove one of the covers to the holes on the back of the machine. The location is different on different models.

The cable from the J2 port on the EDS controller shall then be run through the hole (A) and connected to the RS232 port on the I/O module.

Insert the cable and mount with the counter nut and cable gland according to the figure.




Demount the top panel.



Connect the cable from the J2 port on the EDS controller to the RS232 port on the I/O module.

The connection is in the bottom of the I/O module. It might be necessary to temporarily demount the I/O module to be able to connect.

Strap the cable at suitable positions. The cable must not be in contact with the drum.




Connection to the CPU module

Disconnect the power to the machine.


Remove one of the covers to the holes on the back of the machine. The location is different on different models.

The cable from the J2 port on the EDS controller shall then be run through the hole (A) and connected to the RS232 port on the CPU module at the front of the machine.

Insert the cable and mount with the counter nut and cable gland according to the figure.




Demount the top panel.



Demount the cover.

Connect the cable from the J2 port on the EDS controller to the RS232 port on the CPU module.



Strap the cable at suitable positions. The cable must not be in contact with the drum.

Note!

If there is no free RS232 port on any of the I/O modules it is necessary to install a new I/O module into the machine. Follow the instructions for this in the Service manual for the specific model.

6.3 Installation on Clarus Control


The cable from the RJ11 port on the EDS controller shall be connected to the X10 connection on the CPU card A1 CPU card A1 has different locations depending on machine model. Follow the instruction for your type of machine.

Disconnect the power to the machine.

The cable from the RJ11 port on the EDS controller shall be run through a hole at the back of the machine (A) and connected to the X10 connection on the CPU card A1.

Insert the cable and mount with the counter nut and cable gland according to the figure.




Demount the top panel and remove the cover over the connection module.

Locate the X10 connection on back right side on the CPU card A1.

Connect the cable from the RJ11 port on the EDS controller to the CPU card A1.

Strap the cable at suitable positions. The cable must not be in contact with the drum.


Disconnect the power to the machine.

Open the electric cabinet on the back of the machine.


Locate the X10 connection on the CPU card A1.

The cable from the RJ11 port on the EDS controller shall be run through a hole at the back of the machine (A) and connected to the X10 connection on the CPU card A1.

Insert the cable and mount with the counter nut and cable gland according to the figure.




Connect the cable from the RJ11 port on the EDS controller to the X10 connection on the CPU card A1. Strap the cable at suitable positions.



On W4400H/W4600H machines with serial number up to –980/1287 and W4850H/W41100H machines with serial number up to –1220/636, the X10 connection is NOT located at the back of the machine but in the front. In this case, the X10 connection shall not be used. Instead, it is necessary to install a DMIS kit (the art. No. for the DMIS kit is 988916197).

Install the DMIS kit according to the instructions enclosed with the kit.

When the DMIS kit has been installed, cut the 3-pole X10 connector and strip the three wires approx. 6 mm (1/4 inch). Connect the wires to the terminal (B) enclosed with the DMIS kit.




You can easily check if the machine already has DMIS installed by locating the terminal (B). If terminal (B) is connected; DMIS is installed.

If the machine already has DMIS installed, replace the wires to the terminal (B) with the new. Cut the 3-pole X10 connector and strip the three wires approx. 6 mm (1/4 inch). Connect the wires to the terminal (B) enclosed with the DMIS kit.

7 Programming

7.1 Operating panel

The buttons on the operating panel are used to scroll around in the menu tree. To activate a menu and to save a setting press Enter.

7.2 Language settings

The EDS controller is pre-set from factory with English and Spanish languages. Other languages can be downloaded from the ELS website directly to a USB stick (16 GB or smaller).

If changing from one of the pre-set languages, the language-enabled USB stick must be connected **before** powering up the EDS controller.

Insert the language enabled USB stick. Power up the EDS controller, select language and press Enter to save.

7.3 Time and date settings

When the language has been set the "Date and time menu" appears automatically on the display.

Set the date and time and press Enter to save.

The date is set as YYYY-MM-DD.

The time is set as HH:MM.



Press Enter to stop when 250 ml has been drawn out of the container.

Repeat the calibration for all of the pumps.

The CALIBRATE MANUAL menu allows a known amount to be entered in ml per min.

7.8 Dosing formula set up

In the PROGRAM FORMULA menu it is possible to create, edit and save dosing formulas.

- Up to 50 dosing formulas may be created within the EDS controller.
- Each dosing formula can be assigned to all six of the multiple Electrolux wash programs available in the machine.
- If utilised correctly the EDS controller can be utilisied for up to 300 Electrolux wash programs.

Required software

The programming and set up are made with Laundry Program Manager or Formula Editor Program.

- For Laundry Program Manager the software is distributed as 2 kits. One kit is for Compass Pro and Compass Control and one kit is for Clarus Control. Instructions for programming with Laundry Program Manager is enclosed with the kit.
- For Formula Editor Program the software is downloaded to a Windows based PC from the manufacturers web page. The formula is when ready saved to a .SUP-file that is loaded to the EDS controller via a USB stick. Download the Formula Editor Program: http://hydrosystemseurope.com/support/downloads/

7.11 Selection of operation mode

There are two different operation modes, Standard mapping and Euro mapping.

In standard mapping there are 5 available washer signals/programs. Each signal is capable of running up to 3 pumps and each pump is capable of dispensing up to 3 different amounts; A, B and C. Each product can be allocated to more than one washer signal.






7.12 Dual controller mode — Lagoon advanced care

A dosing formula must be set up for each EDS controller. The set up are made in the Formula editor or in the EDS controller.

7.12.1 Set up in the Formula editor

In the Formula editor, select the CONTROL SETUP menu and program both EDS controllers in the normal way. In the DUAL CONTROLLER box, choose CONTROLLER 1 for the first EDS controller and CONTROLLER 2 for the second EDS controller.



Note!

In the Formula editor, whether you choose CONTROLLER 1 or 2, the pumps on both dosing formula files are numbered 1–6.

Select the STANDARD FORMULAS menu and enter the product amounts that you wish to dispense in each dosing formula for each EDS controller.

For example, if you have 12 wash programs and you want to use the first EDS controller for programs 1–6 and the second EDS controller for programs 7–12, enter the product amounts for dosing formulas 1–6 in controller 1 and leave dosing formulas 7–12 empty. Then enter the product amounts for dosing formulas 7–12 in controller 2 and leave dosing formulas 1–6 empty.

All 12 dosing formulas on both EDS controllers must be allocated to the corresponding wash program in the machine. This means that dosing formula 1 on controllers 1 and 2 must be allocated to the same wash program in the machine (normally program 1) and dosing formula 2 on controllers 1 and 2 must be allocated to the same wash program in the machine (normally program 2) and so on until all dosing formulas are allocated to the wash programs in the machine.

7.13 Temperature validation

The EDS Controller can be used to record the time that a machine is at, or above a specific temperature. This information can be used to show thermal disinfection of a wash load.

This temperature validation can be activated together with either EDS pump stand connection or the other separate PNC of stand alone power supply kit. For easy use, this temperature validation setting can be done only in the EDS controller, not available in the formula editor.



Rules of temperature validation

- When setting custom ranges, temperatures must be set in incremental order. The lowest temperature at temperature 1, up to the highest temperature at temperature 4.
- Each temperature must be different; you cannot have a temperature set more than once with different times.
- You can have different temperatures with the same time.

8 Test run

Test run the system when the installation completed.

Select a wash program, start the washer extractor and observe a test load to ensure that all products dispense only when they are supposed to dispense.

10 Trouble shooting and service

No product on signal

When trouble shooting for no product on signal:

- · Confirm that calibration has been made correctly.
- Confirm that dosing formula amounts are correctly programmed in the EDS controller.

Disconnect the power and the water before carrying out any maintenance or cleaning on the units.

Trouble shooting may only be carried out by qualified service personnel.

If the supply cord is damaged it must be replaced, NOT repaired.

• Confirm that the product is allocated to a signal.

J1 and RS232 cable

Ensure that all cables are clean and corrosion free. Ensure there are no cuts or kinks which can indicate broken wires. Always replace, NOT repair, damaged cables.

11 Disposal information

11.1 Disposal of appliance at end of life

Before disposing of the machine, make sure to carefully check its physical condition, and in particular any parts of the structure that can give or break during scrapping.

The machine's parts must be disposed of in a differentiated way, according to their different characteristics (e.g. metals, oils, greases, plastic, rubber, etc.).

Different regulations are in force in the various countries, therefore comply with the provisions of the laws and competent bodies in the country where scrapping takes place.

In general, the appliance must be taken to a specialised collection/scrapping centre.

Dismantle the appliance, grouping the components according to their chemical characteristics, remembering that the compressor contains lubricant oil and refrigerant fluid which can be recycled, and that the refrigerator and heat pump components are special waste assimilable with urban waste.



The symbol on the product indicates that this product should not be treated as domestic waste, but must be correctly disposed of in order to prevent any negative consequences for the environment and human health. For further information on the recycling of this product, contact the local dealer or agent, the Customer Care service or the local body responsible for waste disposal.

Note!

When scrapping the machine, any marking, this manual and other documents concerning the appliance must be destroyed.

11.2 Disposal of packing

The packing must be disposed of in compliance with the current regulations in the country where the appliance is used. All the packing materials are environmentally friendly.

They can be safely kept, recycled or burned in an appropriate waste incineration plant. Recyclable plastic parts are marked as following examples.
