1 Safety Precautions

WARNING. This appliance is intended only for drying textiles washed in water.

DO NOT MODIFY THIS APPLIANCE.

Servicing shall be carried out only by authorized personnel.

Only authorized spare parts shall be used.

When performing service or replacing parts, the power must be disconnected.

Stationary appliances not fitted with means for disconnection from the supply mains having a contact separation in all poles that provide full disconnection under overvoltage category III, means for disconnection must be incorporated in the fixed wiring in accordance with the wiring rules.

1.1 General safety information

Do not hose down the machine with water.

In order to prevent damage to the electronics (and other parts) that may occur as the result of condensation, the machine should be placed in room temperature for 24 hours before being used for the first time.

2 Warranty terms and exclusions

If the purchase of this product includes warranty coverage, warranty is provided in line with local regulations and subject to the product being installed and used for the purposes as designed, and as described within the appropriate equipment documentation.

Warranty will be applicable where the customer has used only genuine spare parts and has performed maintenance in accordance with Electrolux Professional AB user and maintenance documentation made available in paper or electronic format.

Electrolux Professional AB strongly recommends using Electrolux Professional AB approved cleaning, rinse and descaling agents to obtain optimal results and maintain product efficiency over time.

The Electrolux Professional AB warranty does not cover:

- service trips cost to deliver and pick up the product;
- installation;
- training on how to use/operate;
- replacement (and/or supply) of wear and tear parts unless resulting from defects in materials or workmanship reported within one (1) week from the failure;
- correction of external wiring;
- correction of unauthorized repairs as well as any damages, failures and inefficiencies caused by and/or resulting from;
 - insufficient and/or abnormal capacity of the electrical systems (current/voltage/frequency, including spikes and/or outages);
 - inadequate or interrupted water supply, steam, air, gas (including impurities and/or other that does not comply with the technical requirements for each appliance);
 - plumbing parts, components or consumable cleaning products that are not approved by the manufacturer;
 - customer's negligence, misuse, abuse and/or non-compliance with the use and care instructions detailed within the appropriate equipment documentation;

3 Appliance layout

3.1 Components

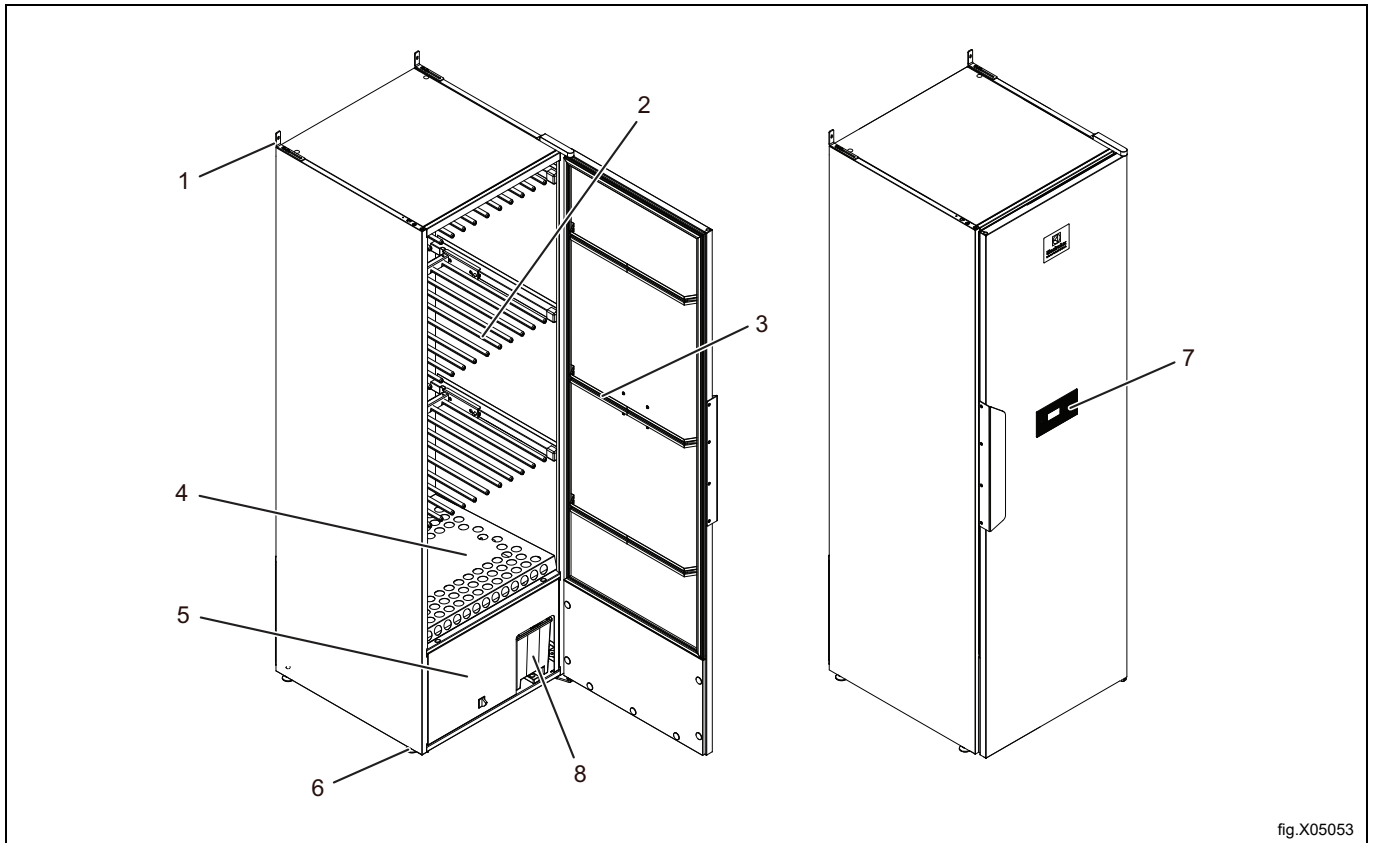

3.2 Drying principle

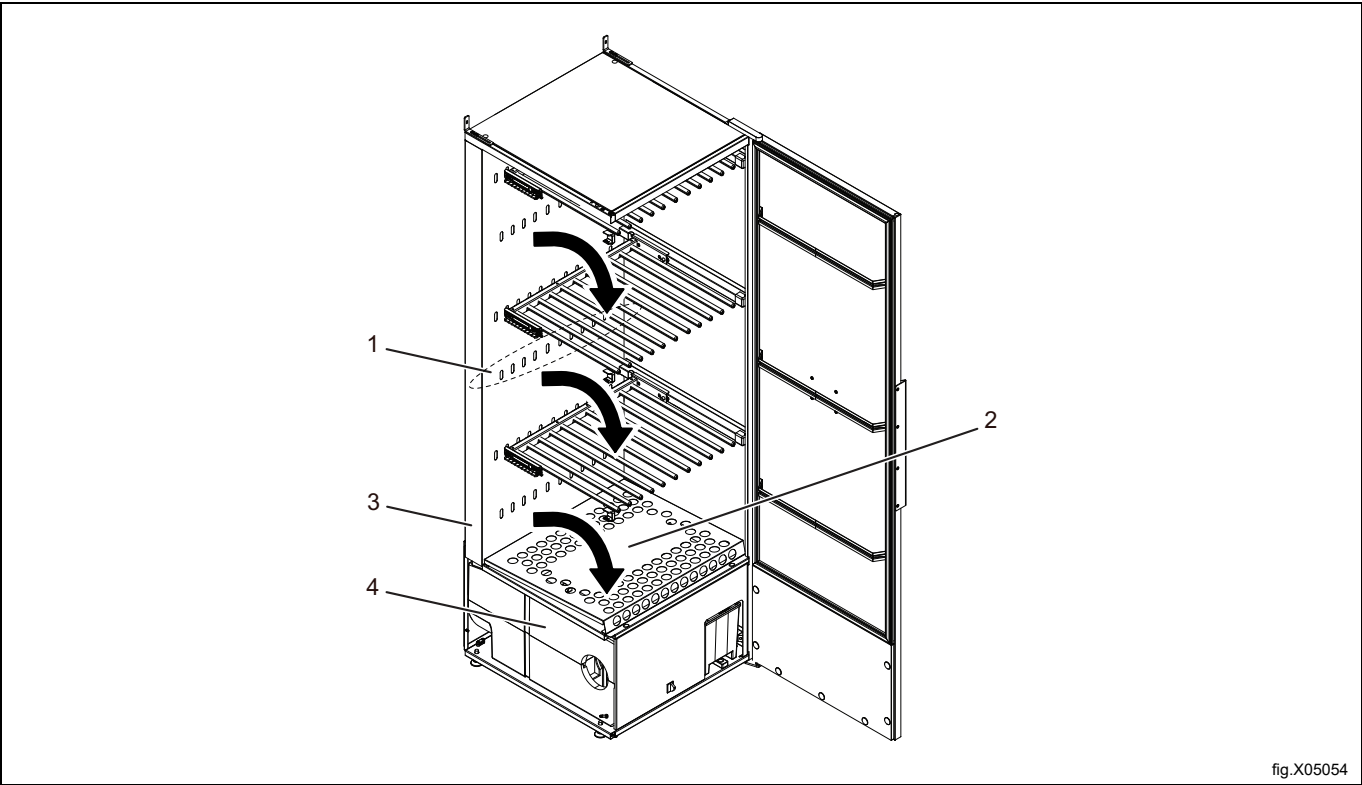
The drying cabinet works according to the principle of heat pump with dehumidifier unit instead of conventional hot air unit. This dries the garments at a lower heat and with significantly lower energy consumption.

The cabinet is a completely closed system. No exhaust air connection is required. The moisture is condensed during the process, and the water formed is directed to the drain via a hose.

In addition, the fan is so powerful that it makes the garments sway, making the drying process even more efficient.

3.3 Air flow

The figure shows the air flow in the drying cabinet.



1	Air flow
2	Filter under the shoe rack
3	Return air after dehumidification. Enters a duct in the back of the drying cabinet
4	Dehumidifier unit



Make sure that shoes and other items placed in the cabinet do not block air flow.



Note!
The door's sealing strip may not close completely when the cabinet is cold. However, this is fully offset when the cabinet is running as the heat causes the sealing strip to expand.

3.4 Condensation

The condensation can be led away in two ways, either collected in a removable water tank or diverted to the floor drain with a hose.

3.4.1 Removable water tank

The water tank is dimensioned to be large enough completely dry a load by a good margin. But make a habit of always emptying the water tank before each round of drying.

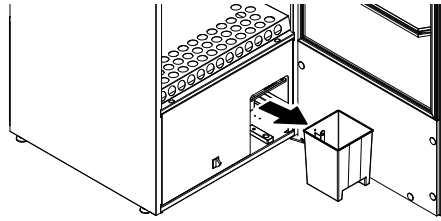

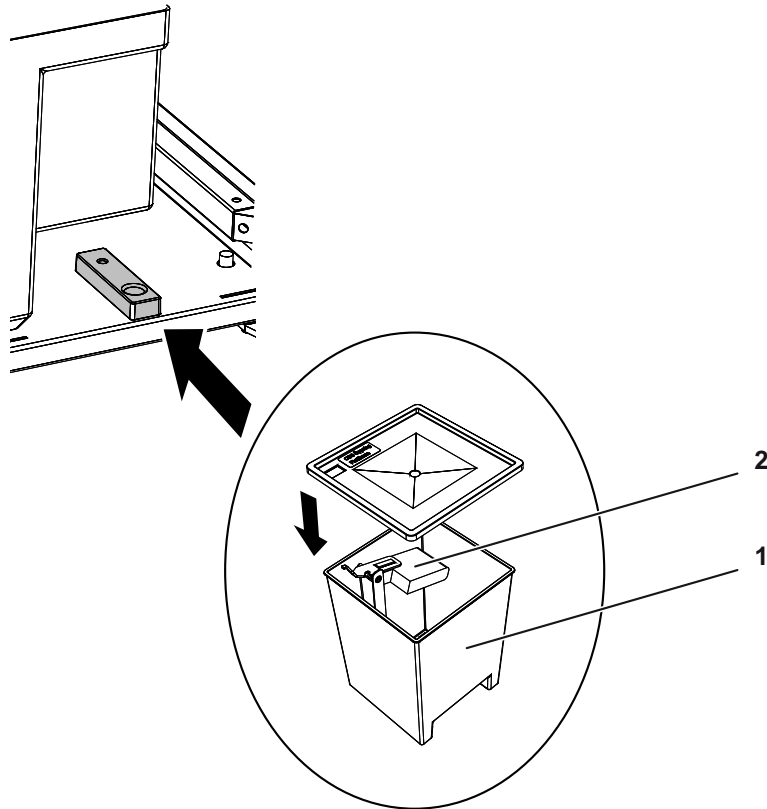

3.4.2 Connection to floor drain

The drying cabinet is delivered with a hose for the removable water tank.
The connection can be changed to condensation drainage via the floor drain.

4 Operation

4.1 Advice and tips for using the drying cabinet with dehumidifier

- Do not hang garments that have not been spun properly in a washer extractor in the drying cabinet
- Do not hang the garments too close together as it will prolong the drying time
- The doors must always be closed during the drying process

4.2 Operation

- Position the laundry evenly spread out on the hangers and close the door.
- Select a drying program (A).
Drying will start when the program button is pressed. A symbol on the left side of the display (B) indicates that the drying process is in progress.
- The drying cabinet will stop automatically when the laundry is dry.
 - When the textiles are dry, the drying process switches to a cool-down period that ends automatically after 3 minutes.
 - During the cool-down period, the text "COOL" is shown on the display.
 - When the cool-down period is ended, the text "END" is shown on the display (flashing).
- To cancel the drying cycle, press the stop button (C).

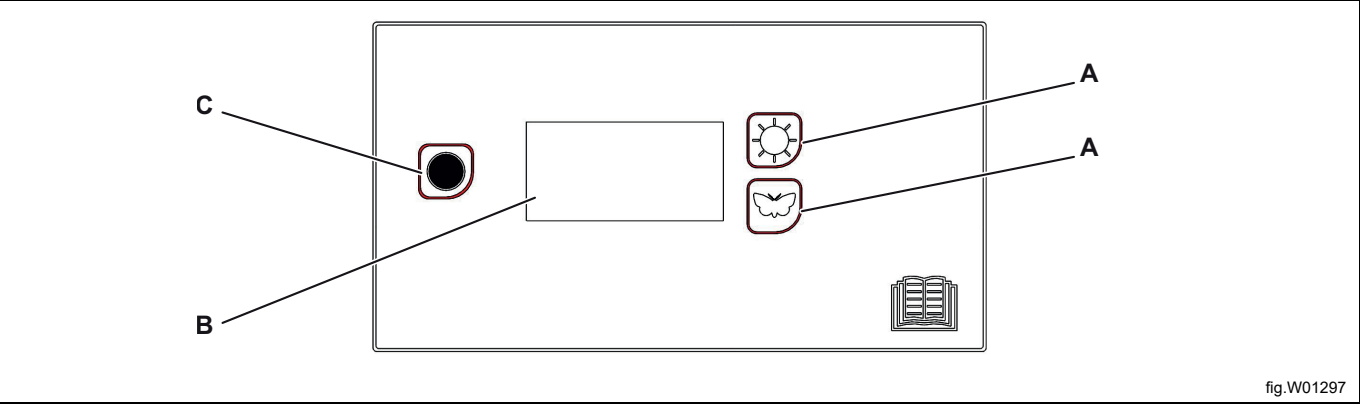

4.4 Loads

For optimum energy efficient drying, operate with a full load and do not open the door until the appliance has stopped. If the door is opened during drying, the drying time will increase.

The drying cabinet has three hanger sections. Each section has a number of rods on which the laundry is hung. Hanging the laundry according to the following instructions will result in the most efficient drying result.

- Hang the items in the drying cabinet according to how much room they require and not according to their weight.
- Do not lay items flat on the upper hanger section.
- Hang long items closest to the walls of the drying cabinet and shorter items towards the center.
- Fold up the two lower hanger sections if long items are to be dried.
- Hang gloves, caps, scarves and the like on the hanger bars on the inside of the door.
- Do not overload the drying cabinet. The laundry will become creased and dry unevenly. Leave some space between the items if possible. To avoid the transferring of colors, make sure materials are not touching each other.
- Avoid drying thick items at the same time as lighter items as they hold more moisture and have completely different drying times. If so, remove the lighter items when they are dry to reduce the drying time for the thick items that are left.
- Do not hang knitted items. These will stretch unnecessarily as they are heavy when wet. Follow the instructions on the care label of the garment as far as possible.

5 Maintenance

It is the responsibility of the owner of the appliance/the laundry manager to make sure that maintenance is performed regularly.

Note!

Lack of maintenance may deteriorate the performance of the appliance and may cause damage to components.

5.1 Cleaning

The cabinet's walls can be cleaned using a damp cloth and a mild soap solution.

Before each drying process, remove the shoe rack and clean the filter under the rack.

The cleaning filter is brushed clean with the provided brush.

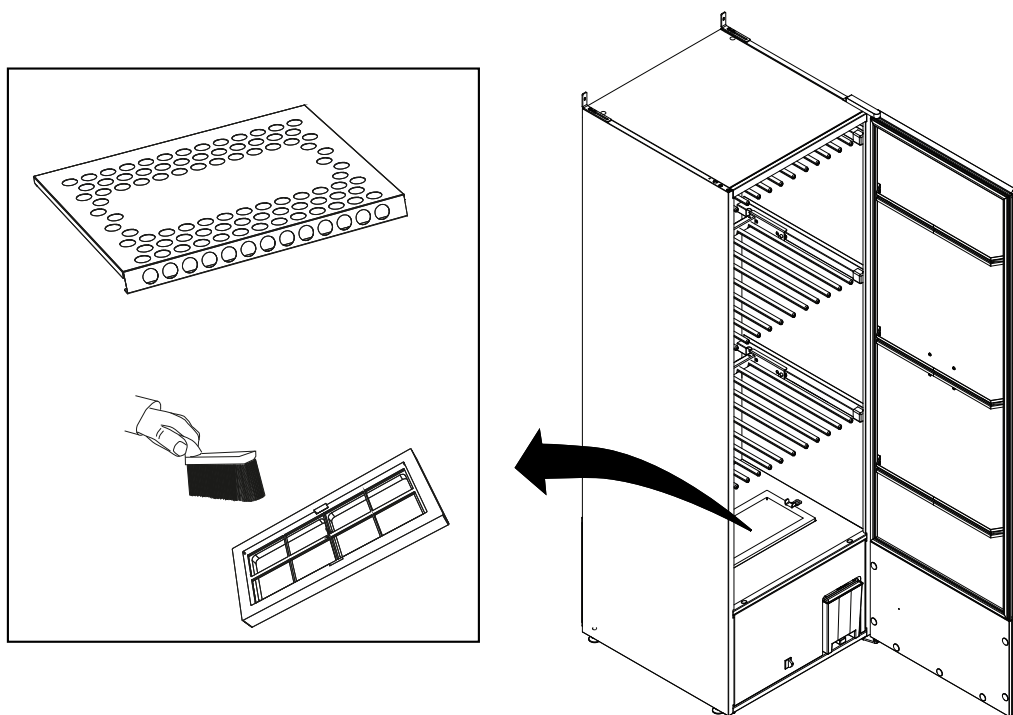

6 Servicing

Before contacting the service department, you should find out the name, article number and serial number of the drying cabinet.

This information can be found on the identification plate located on the inside of the cabinet (A).

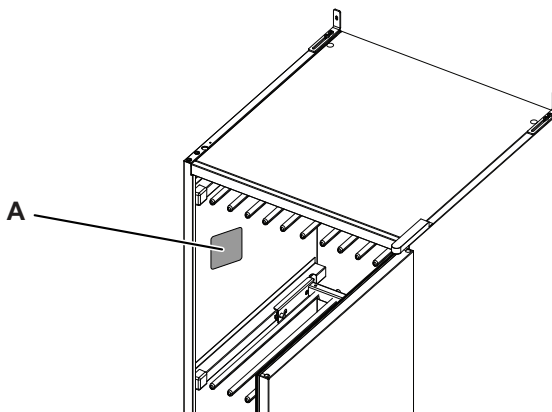

7 Troubleshooting

Problem	What you can do
The drying cabinet does not work	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Check that the power cord is connected to an electrical outlet. 2. Check that no fuse has been tripped. 3. Did you press the start button? 4. Is the door closed? 5. Is the condensation tank in place and empty?
The display shows "Check Water Pump"	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Empty the water tank. 2. Check that the cover is fitted so that the float arm projects through the opening in the cover and the arm runs freely. 3. Check that the water tank is turned so that the float arm faces inwards in the box. 4. If the none of the above work, the safety switch for defective pump may have been activated. If this is the case, contact a service technician.
The display shows "Clean Filter"	<p>Clean the filter and restart the cabinet.</p> <p>The Stop button must be held depressed for 5 seconds to reset the alarm.</p>
The display shows an alarm/error code	<p>This should normally not occur. But if an alarm or error code is shown, start by trying to reset the alarm by holding the Stop button depressed for 5 seconds. If the problem recurs, contact a service technician.</p>
Drying takes a long time	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Clean the filter (must be done after each drying session). 2. Check that the water tank is empty. 3. Check that the right program was selected for the type of garments in question. 4. Check to ensure the garments are not extremely wet (poorly centrifuged). 5. Check that there is not too much laundry in the cabinet.
The laundry does not get dry	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Check that the right program was selected for the type of garments in question. 2. Check that there is not too much laundry in the cabinet. 3. The software that controls the drying process requires adjustment. Contact a service technician.
The sealing strip does not create a seal/there is a gap at the door	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Check that the cabinet is level. Check with a spirit level and adjust via the adjustable feet if necessary. 2. Check that the filter and its holder are correctly installed. The holder should be pressed against the underlying heat pump unit to seal properly. 3. Make sure that no debris, gravel or the like has ended up under the filter holder, as this would prevent it from sealing properly.

8 Error codes

No.	Name	Description
ER 03	Moisture sensor error	Contact a service technician
ER 04	Max time for drying process exceeded	Contact a service technician
ER 08	Clean the filter	100 hours have passed since the last filter cleaning (since the last time the alarm was reset). Note! The cabinet will continue to work despite the alarm. It is only intended as a reminder.
ER 10	Check the water pump	Water level in the condensation tank too high; switch at float actuated. See troubleshooting
ER 12	Communication timeout	Contact a service technician

The Stop button must be held depressed for 5 seconds to reset an error code.

9 Disposal information

9.1 Appliance recyclability and disposal

9.1.1 Recyclability

Our appliances are manufactured using a significant percentage of recyclable metals (such as stainless steel, iron, aluminium, galvanized sheet, copper, etc.), which can be recovered through the local recycling systems, in compliance with the regulations in force in the country of use.

National regulations regarding waste disposal may vary. Disposal of the appliance must therefore be carried out in accordance with the applicable legislation and the directives issued by the competent authorities in the country where the appliance is decommissioned.

The components of the appliance must be separated and disposed of in accordance with their material composition (e.g. metals, oils, greases, plastics, rubber, refrigerant gases, insulating boards and other insulating material, glass wool, LEDs, etc.) and in full compliance with applicable local and international waste management regulations.

Compressors may contain oils and refrigerants fluids - are special waste and has to be recycled on local bases regulations.

9.1.2 Procedure regarding appliance disposal and component / material recovery

This product should not simply be disposed of in the environment at the end of its life cycle; it is imperative instead either to dispose of it in accordance with local environmental regulations, or, preferably, to deliver it whole to an authorized recycling center.

All removed components, including doors and other structural parts, must be delivered together with the appliance to an authorized recycling or dismantling facility.

The dismantling/recycling center will apply state of the art technologies and methods available to them to effectively disassemble the products for best recyclability.

Note that printed circuit boards, electrical motors or other components identified in European Union legislation to be of high critical raw materials recovery potential need to be addressed specifically.

In case of doubts or questions, always refer to your reference customer care service.

Before disposing of the appliance, carefully inspect its physical condition and preservation state, checking for potential leaks of liquids or gases, as well as for broken parts that may pose hazards during handling and subsequent dismantling.



The symbol on the product indicates that this product should not be treated as domestic waste, but must be correctly disposed of in order to prevent any negative consequences for the environment and human health. For further information on the recycling of this product, contact the local dealer or agent, the customer care service or the local body responsible for waste disposal.

Note!

When dismantling the appliance, any marking, this manual and other documents concerning the appliance must be destroyed.

9.2 Disposal of packing

The packing must be disposed of in compliance with the current regulations in the country where the appliance is used. All the packing materials are environmentally friendly.

They can be safely kept, recycled or burned in an appropriate waste incineration plant. Recyclable plastic parts are marked as following examples.
