1. A SAFETY INFORMATION

Before the installation and use of the appliance, carefully read the supplied instructions. The manufacturer is not responsible for any injuries or damage that are the result of incorrect installation or usage. Always keep the instructions in a safe and accessible location for future reference.

- 1.1 Children and vulnerable people safety
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- Children between 3 and 8 years of age and persons with very extensive and complex disabilities shall be kept away from the appliance unless continuously supervised.
- Children of less than 3 years of age should be kept away from the appliance unless continuously supervised.
- Do not let children play with the appliance.
- Keep all packaging away from children and dispose of it appropriately.
- Keep detergents away from children.
- Keep children and pets away from the appliance when the door is open.
- If the appliance has a child safety device, it should be activated.
- Children shall not carry out cleaning and user maintenance of the appliance without supervision.

1.2 Installation

- This appliance is for household and commercial use.
- Follow the installation instructions supplied with the appliance.
- Remove all the packaging and the transit bolts.
- Keep the transit bolts in a safe place. If the appliance is to be moved in the future they must be reattached to lock the drum to prevent an internal damage.
- Always take care when moving the appliance as it is heavy. Always use safety gloves and enclosed footwear.
- Do not install or use a damaged appliance.
- Make sure that the appliance is stable during transportation.
- Make sure that the appliance is disconnected from the electricity supply during installation, maintenance and repairs and cannot be reconnected until all work has been carried out.
- Do not install or use the appliance where the temperature can be less than 0°C or where it is exposed to the weather.
- Make sure that all health and safety regulations are obeyed when the appliance is installed in a commercial/ public environment.
- Do not install the appliance in a moving platform (e.g. on a ship).
- The floor area on which the appliance is to be installed must be flat, stable, heat resistant and clean.
- Make sure that there is air circulation between the appliance and the floor.
- The ventilation openings in the base (if applicable) must not be obstructed by a carpet.
- Adjust the feet to have the necessary space between the appliance and the carpet.
- Do not install the appliance where the appliance door can not be fully opened.

- Do not put a container to collect possible water leakage under the appliance. Contact the Authorised Service Centre to ensure which accessories can be used.
- 1.3 Electrical Connection
- The appliance must be correctly earthed. The manufacturer is not responsible for the consequences of an inadequate earthing system.
- Always use a correctly installed shockproof socket.
- Make sure that the parameters on the rating plate are compatible with the electrical ratings of the mains power supply.
- Do not use multi-plug adapters and extension cables.
- Make sure not to cause damage to the mains plug and to the mains cable.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its Authorised Service Centre or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.
- Connect the mains plug to the mains socket only at the end of the installation. Make sure that there is access to the mains plug after the installation.
- Do not touch the mains cable or the mains plug with wet hands.
- Do not pull the mains cable to disconnect the appliance. Always pull the mains plug.
- 1.4 Water connection
- Do not cause damage to the water hoses.
- The appliance is to be connected to the water mains using the new supplied hose-sets. Old hose sets must not be reused.
- Before connection to new pipes, pipes not used for a long time, where repair work has been carried out or new devices fitted (water meters, etc.), let the water flow until it is clean and clear.

- The operating water pressure (minimum and maximum) must be between 0.5 bar (0.05 MPa) and 10 bar (1.0 MPa).
- Ensure that there are no visible water leaks during and after the first use of the appliance.

1.5 Use

- Do not change the speci ication of this appliance.
- Obey the safety instructions on the detergent packaging.
- Obey the maximum load volume of 8 kg (refer to the "Program chart" chapter).
- Do not put lammable products or items that are wet with lammable products in, near or on the appliance.
- Make sure that you remove all metal objects from the laundry.
- Do not touch the glass of the door while a program operates. The glass can be hot.

1.6 Care and cleaning

- Before maintenance, deactivate the appliance and disconnect the mains plug from the mains socket.
- Do not use water spray and steam to clean the appliance.
- Clean the appliance with a moist soft cloth. Use only neutral detergents. Do not use abrasive products, abrasive cleaning pads, solvents or metal objects.

1.7 Internal lighting

Risk of injury.

- Visible LED radiation, do not look directly into the beam.
- To replace the internal lighting, contact the Authorised Service Centre.

1.8 Service

- To repair the appliance contact the Authorised Service Centre. Use original spare parts only.
- Please note that self-repair or non-professional repair can have safety consequences and might void the guarantee.
- Concerning the lamp(s) inside this product and spare part lamps sold separately: These lamps are intended to withstand extreme physical conditions in household appliances, such as temperature, vibration, humidity, or are intended to signal information about the operational status of the appliance. They are not intended to be used in other applications and are not suitable for household room illumination.
- 1.9 Disposal
- Disconnect the appliance from the mains electrical and water supplies.
- Cut off the mains electrical cable close to the appliance and dispose of it.
- Remove the door catch to prevent children or pets from becoming trapped in the drum.

2. PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

2.1 Appliance overview

The rating plate reports the model name (A) , product number (B), electrical ratings (C) and serial number (D).

2.2 Accessories



1 Spanner To remove the transit bolts.

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- 2 Plastic hose guide To connect the drain hose on the edge of a sink.
 - Plastic caps To close the holes on the rear side of the cabinet after the removal of the transit bolts.
 - Inlet hoses To connect the appliance to the cold and hot water tap: blue cap hose for cold water and red cap hose for hot water.
- 5 Flap for liquid detergent To slow down the liquid detergent flow.

2.3 Available from your authorized vendor

Only appropriate accessories approved by Electrolux ensure the safety standards of the appliance. If unapproved parts are used, any claims will be invalidated.

Stacking kit

3.1 Electrical connection

At the end of installation you can connect the mains plug to the mains socket.

The rating plate and the 'Technical Data' chapter indicate the necessary electrical ratings. Make sure that they are compatible with the mains power supply.

Check that your domestic electrical installation can take the maximum load required, also taking into account any other appliances in use.

Connect the appliance to an earthed socket.



4. CONTROL PANEL

4.1 Control panel description

The power supply cable must be easily accessible after installing the appliance.

For any electrical work required to install this appliance, contact our Authorised Service Centre.

5. BEFORE FIRST USE

- 1. Make sure that all transit bolts are removed.
- 2. Make sure that the electrical and water connection are available.
- 3. Put 2 litre of water in the detergent compartment for washing phase. This activates the drain system.
- Set and start a program for cotton at the highest temperature without detergent and laundry. This removes all possible dirt from the drum and the tub.

7. OPTIONS

7.1 Pre rinse

Press this button to add a pre rinse phase without detergent before washing.

The related indicator comes on U.

7.2 Pre wash

With this option you can add a prewash phase to a washing program.

Use this option for heavy soil.

When you set this option the program duration increases.

The related indicator comes on \amalg .

7.3 Extra rinse

With this option you can add some rinses to a washing program.

Use this option for persons allergic to detergents and in areas where the water is soft.

The related indicator comes on 📟.

7.4 Spin time

By pressing this button you can decrease the spin time. Once you reach the

8.1 Acoustic signals

The acoustic signals operate when:

- You activate the appliance.
- You select a program.
- You deactivate the appliance.

minimum time (5 seconds) it restarts form the maximum time again.

The related indicator comes on BBB.

7.5 No softener

Press this button to exclude the softener load.

The related indicator comes on \varnothing .

Press this button again, the softener is loaded normally.

The related indicator comes on \bigcirc .

7.6 Delay start

With this option you can delay the start of a program from 30 minutes to 24 hours.

The display shows the related indicator

- You press the buttons.
- The program is completed.
- The appliance has a malfunction.

To deactivate/activate the acoustic signals, press $\stackrel{+}{\boxtimes}$ and $\stackrel{+}{\odot}$ at the same time for 6 seconds.



If you deactivate the acoustic signals, they continue operate when the appliance has a malfunction.

8.2 Child Lock

With this option you can prevent that the children play with the control panel.

- To activate/deactivate this option, press the \iiii/ and \ldots buttons simultaneously until the related indicator comes on in the dispaly:
 - T: Child lock activated.

– T: Child lock deactivated. You can activate this option:

• After you press **I** : the options and the program knob are locked.

9. DAILY USE

9.1 Loading the laundry

- 1. Pull the handle to open the appliance door
- 2. Shake the items before you put them in the appliance.
- 3. Put the laundry in the drum, one item at a time.

Make sure not to put too much laundry in the drum.

4. Close the door.



• Before you press ▷II : the appliance cannot start.

i If the appliance is connected to coin operated machine, the child lock activates automatically 5 minutes after the program start.

8.3 Permanent Extra Rinse

With this option you can permanently have an extra rinse when you set a new program.

• To activate/deactivate this option press

indicator 📾 comes on/goes off.



Make sure that no laundry stays between the seal and the door. There is a risk of water leakage or damage to the laundry.

9.2 Installing the flap for liquid detergent



- Open the detergent dispenser.
- Install the flap for liquid detergent in the compartment III.

9.3 Using detergent and additives

- 1. Measure out the detergent and the fabric conditioner.
- 2. Put the detergent and the fabric conditioner into the compartments.
- 3. Carefully close the detergent drawer



9.4 Detergent compartments

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9.5 Liquid or powder detergent

- Position A for powder detergent (factory setting).
- Position B for liquid detergent.

When you use the liquid detergent:

- Do not use gelatinous or thick liquid detergents.
- Do not put more liquid then the maximum level.
- Do not set the prewash phase.
- Do not set the delay start.



9.6 Activating the appliance

Press the button \bigcirc to activate the appliance. A tune sounds (if it is activated).

9.7 Setting a program

- 1. Turn the program knob and set the program:
 - The related program indicator comes on. A tune sounds (if it is activated).
 - The indicator of button Start/Pause lashes.
 - The display shows the program duration and the indicators of the program phases.
- 2. If necessary, change the spin time and add the available options. When you activate an option, the indicator of the set option comes on.



If you set something incorrect, the display shows the message Err.

9.8 Starting a program

Press the button
$$\triangleright$$
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- The indicator of the button **I** stops lashing and stays on.
- The indicator of the running phase starts lashing on the display.
- The program starts and the door locks.
- The drain pump can operate for a short time when the appliance ills water.

After approximately 15 minutes from the start of the

program:

- The appliance can adjust the program duration automatically depending with the laundry load.
- The display shows the new time to end.

9.9 Starting a program with the delay start

 Press Delay start repeatedly until the display shows the delay you want to set.

The related indicator comes on the display \bigcirc .

2. Press Start/Pause :

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- The appliance starts the countdown.
- When the countdown is completed, the program starts automatically.
- You can cancel or change the set of the delay start before you press Start/Pause. To cancel the delay start:
 - Press Start/Pause to set the appliance to pause.
 - Press Delay start until the display shows *D*.
 - Press Start/Pause
 again to start the
 program immediately.

9.10 Cancelling the delay start

To cancel the delay start:

1. Press button Start/Pause to set the appliance to pause.

The related indicator flashes.

- 2. Press button Delay start repeatedly until the display shows **1**.
- 3. Press button Start/Pause again to start the program immediately.

9.11 Interrupting a program and changing the options

You can change only some options before they operate.

1. Press Start/Pause . The indicator lashes.

2. Change the options.

3. Press Start/Pause again.

The program continues.

i If the appliance is connected to a coin operated machine, you can interrupt a program only 5 minutes after the program start. After this time the child lock automatically activates.

9.12 Cancelling a running program

 Press the button ① for some seconds to cancel the program and to deactivate the appliance.

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WARNING!

If the appliance has already uploaded water, the door remains locked.

- Press the same button again to activate the appliance. Now, you can set a new washing program.
- $(\mathbf{i}$
- Before starting the new program the appliance could drain the water. In this case, make sure that the detergent is still in the detergent compartment, if not fill the detergent again.

9.13 At the end of the program

The appliance stops automatically. In the display \square comes on.

The indicator of button \square goes off.

The door unlocks.

- 1. Open the door.
- 2. Remove the laundry from the appliance. Make sure that the drum is empty.
- 3. Close the water tap.
- Press the button ① for some seconds to deactivate the appliance.
 Keep the door ajar, to prevent the mildew

Keep the door ajar, to prevent the mildew and odours.

9.14 AUTO OFF option

The AUTO OFF option automatically deactivates the appliance to decrease the energy consumption when:

 You do not use the appliance for 5 minutes before you press the button
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Press the button $\ensuremath{\bigodot}$ to activate the appliance again.

• After 5 minutes from the end of the washing program.

Press the button ① to activate the appliance again. The display shows the end of the last set program.

10. HINTS AND TIPS

WARNING! Refer to Safety chapters.

10.1 The laundry load

- Divide the laundry in: white, coloured, synthetics, delicates and wool.
- Obey the washing instructions that are on the laundry care labels.
- Do not wash white and coloured items together.
- Some coloured items can discolour with the first wash. We recommend that you wash them separately for the first times.
- Turn multilayered fabrics, wool and items with painted illustrations inside out.
- Wash and pre-treat heavy soil stains with a suitable detergent before putting in drum.
- Be careful with the curtains. Remove the hooks and put the curtains in a washing bag or pillowcase.
- Do not wash laundry without hems or with cuts. Use a washing bag to wash small and/or delicate items (e.g. underwired bras, belts, tights, shoelaces, ribbons, etc.).



 A very small load can cause balance problems with the spin phase leading to excessive vibration. If this occurs:

 interrupt the program and open the door (refer to "Daily Use" chapter);
 manually redistribute the load so that the items are spaced evenly around the tub;

 Turn the program knob to set a new cycle.

-press the Start/Pause button. The spin phase continues.

- Button up pillowcases, close zippers, hooks and poppers. Tie up belts, cords, shoelaces, ribbons and any other loose elements.
- Empty the pockets and unfold the items.



10.2 Stubborn stains

For some stains, water and detergent is not sufficient.

We recommend that you pre-treat these stains before you put the items in the appliance.

Special stain removers are available. Use the special stain remover that is applicable to the type of stain and fabric.

Do not spray stain remover on garments near the appliance as it is corrosive to the plastic parts.



10.3 Detergent type and quantity.

The choice of detergent and use of correct quantities not only affects your wash

performance, but also helps to avoid waste and protect the environment:

- Use only detergents and other treatments specially made for washing machines. First, follow these generic rules:
 - powder detergents for all types of fabric, excluding delicate. Prefer powder detergents containing bleach for whites and laundry sanitization,
 - liquid detergents, preferably for low temperature wash programs
 (60 °C max) for all types of fabric, or special ones for woollens only.
- The choice and quantity of detergent will depend on: type of fabric (delicates, woollens, cottons, etc), the colour of clothes, size of the load, degree of soiling, wash temperature and hardness of the water used.
- Follow the instructions that you find on packaging of the detergents or other treatments without exceeding the indicated maximum level (MAX).
- Do not mix different types of detergents.
- Use less detergent if:
 - you are washing a small load,
 - the laundry is lightly soiled,
 - there is large amounts of foam during washing.
- When using detergent tabs or pods, always put them inside the drum, not in the detergent dispenser.
- Insufficient detergent may cause:
- unsatisfactory washing results,
- the wash load to turn grey,
- greasy clothes,
- mould in the appliance.

Excessive detergent may cause:

- sudsing,
- reduced washing effect,
- inadequate rinsing,

11. CARE AND CLEANING

10.4 Ecological hints

To save water, energy and to help protect the environment, we recommend that you follow these tips:

- Normally soiled laundry may be washed without prewash in order to save detergent, water and time (the environment is protected too!).
- Loading the appliance to the maximum capacity indicated for each programs helps to reduce energy and water consumption.
- With adequate pre-treatment, stains and limited soiling can be removed; the laundry can then be washed at a lower temperature.
- To use the correct quantity of detergent, refer to the quantity suggested by the detergent producer and check the water hardness of your domestic system. Refer to "Water hardness".
- Set the maximum possible spin speed for the selected washing program before drying your laundry in a tumble dryer. This will save energy during drying!

10.5 Water hardness

If the water hardness in your area is high or moderate, we recommend that you use a water softener for washing machines. In areas where the water hardness is soft it is not necessary to use a water softener.

To know the water hardness in your area, contact your local water authority.

Use the correct quantity of the water softener. Obey the instructions that you find on the packaging of the product.

11.1 Periodic cleaning schedule

Periodic cleaning helps to extend the life of your appliance.

After each cycle, keep the door and the detergent dispenser slightly ajar to get air

circulation and dry the humidity inside the appliance: this will prevent mildew and odours.

If the appliance is not used for a long time: close the water tap and unplug the appliance.

Indicative periodic cleaning schedule:

Descaling	Twice a year
Maintenance wash	Once a month
Clean door seal	Every two months
Clean drum	Every two months
Clean detergent dispenser	Every two months
Clean the inlet hose and the valve filter	Twice a year

The following paragraphs explain how you should clean each part.

11.2 Removing foreign objects

Make sure that pockets are empty and all loose elements are tied up before running your cycle. Refer to 'The laundry load' in 'Hints and tips'.

11.3 External cleaning

Clean the appliance with soap and warm water only. Fully dry all the surfaces. Do not use a scouring pads or any scratching material.



CAUTION!

Do not use alcohol, solvents or chemical products.

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CAUTION!

Do not use the metal surfaces with chlorine-based detergent.

11.4 Descaling

If the water hardness in your area is high or moderate, we recommend that you use a water descaling product for washing machines.

Regularly examine the drum to prevent limescale and rust particles.

To remove rust particles use only special products for washing machines. Do this separately from the laundry wash.



Always obey the instructions that you find on the packaging of the product.

11.5 Maintenance wash

With the low temperature programs it is possible that some detergent stays in the drum. Perform a maintenance wash regularly. To do this:

- Remove all laundry from the drum.
- Select the cotton program with the highest temperature without detergent.

11.6 Door seal



Regularly examine the seal and remove all objects from the inner part.

11.7 Cleaning the drum

Regularly examine the drum to prevent limescale and rust particles. Only use special products to remove rust particles from the drum.

We suggest you to:

- 1. Clean the drum with special product for stainless steel.
- Start a short program for cotton at the maximum temperature with a small quantity of detergent.

11.9 Cleaning the drain filter

- Do not clean the drain filter if the water in the appliance is hot.
- Regularly check the drain pump filter and make sure that it is clean.



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Repeat the steps 2 and 3 until the water stops flowing out.



11.10 Cleaning the inlet hoses and the valve filters

Clean regularly both (for hot and for cold water) inlet hoses and both valve filters.





Because of a malfunction, the appliance cannot drain the water.

If this occurs, do steps (1) through (9) of 'Cleaning the drain filter'. If necessary, clean the pump.

When you drain the water with the emergency drain procedure, you must activate again the drain system:

- When you drain the water with the emergency drain procedure, you must activate again the drain system: Put 2 litres of water in the main wash compartment of the detergent dispenser.
- 2. Start the program to drain the water



11.12 Frost precautions

If the appliance is installed in an area where the temperature can be less than 0° C, remove the remaining water from the inlet hose and the drain pump.

- 1. Disconnect the mains plug from the mains socket.
- 2. Close the water tap.
- 3. Put the two ends of the inlet hose in a container and let the water flow out of the hose.
- 4. Empty the drain pump. Refer to the emergency drain procedure.
- 5. When the drain pump is empty, install the inlet hose again.



WARNING!

Make sure that the temperature is more than 0 °C before you use the appliance again. The manufacturer is not responsible for damages caused by low temperatures.

12. TROUBLESHOOTING



WARNING!

Refer to Safety chapters.

12.1 Alarm Codes and Possible failures

The appliance does not start or it stops during operation. First try to find a solution to the problem (refer to the tables).



WARNING!

Deactivate the appliance before carrying out any check.

With some problems, the display shows an alarm code and the \square button may flash continuously:

Problem	Possible solution
E 10 The appliance does not fill with water properly.	 Make sure that the water tap is open. Make sure that the pressure of the water supply is not too low. For this information, contact your local water authority. Make sure that the water tap is not clogged. Make sure that the filters of the inlet hoses and the filters of the valves are not clogged. Refer to "Care and cleaning". Make sure that the water inlet hoses has no kinks, damages or bends. Make sure that the connections of the water inlet hoses are correct.
E2D The appliance does not drain the water.	 Make sure that the sink spigot is not clogged. Make sure that the drain hose has no kinks or bends. Make sure that the drain filter is not clogged. Clean the filter, if necessary. Refer to "Care and cleaning". Make sure that the connection of the drain hose is correct. Set the drain program if you set an option which ends with water in the tub.
E4D The appliance door is open or not closed correctly.	Make sure that the door is properly closed.

ES: Internal fail. No com- munication between electronic elements of the appliance.		The program was not finished properly or the appliance stopped too early. Switch the appliance off and on again. If the alarm code appears again, contact the Authorised Service Centre.
EHD The mains supply is unstable.	•	Wait until mains supply is stable.

If the display shows other alarm codes, deactivate and activate the appliance. If the problem continues, contact the Authorised Service Centre.

In case of different problem with the washing machine check the table below for possible solutions.

Problem	Possible solution
The program does not start.	 Make sure that the mains plug is connected to the mains socket. Make sure that the appliance door is closed. Make sure that there is no damaged fuse in the fuse box. Make sure that the last been touched. If the delay start is set, cancel the setting or wait for the end of countdown. Deactivate the Child Lock function if it is on. Check the position of the knob on the selected program.
The appliance fills with water and drains immediately.	• Make sure that the drain hose is in the correct position. The hose may be positioned too low. Refer to "Installation instruction".
The spin phase does not operate or the washing cycle lasts longer than usual.	 Make sure that the drain filter is not clogged. Clean the filter, if necessary. Refer to "Care and cleaning". Adjust manually the items in the tub and start the spin phase again. This problem may be caused by balance problems.
There is water on the floor.	 Make sure that the couplings of the water hoses are tight and there is not water leakages. Make sure that the water inlet hose and the drain hose have no damages. Make sure you use the correct detergent and the correct quantity of it. Too much detergent or unsuitable detergent creates too much foam. Reduce detergent quantity and/or use a suita- ble detergent.
You cannot open the appliance door.	Make sure that a washing program that ends with water in tub, has not been selected.Make sure that the washing program is finished.

Problem	Possible solution
The appliance makes an unusual noise and vibrates.	 Make sure the levelling of the appliance is correct. Refer to "Installation instruction". Make sure that the packaging and/or the transit bolts are removed. Refer to "Installation instruction". Add more laundry in the drum. The load may be too small.
The cycle is shorter than the time displayed.	 The appliance calculates a new time according to the laun- dry load.
The washing results are not satisfactory.	 Increase the detergent quantity or use a different detergent. Use special products to remove the stubborn stains before you wash the laundry. Make sure that you set the correct temperature. Decrease the laundry load.
Too much foam in the drum during the washing cycle.	 Reduce the quantity of detergent. Too much detergent or unsuitable detergent has been used. Reduce detergent quantity and/or use a correct detergent.
After the washing cy- cle, there are some detergent residues in the dispenser drawer.	 Make sure that the flap is in the correct position (UP for powder detergent - DOWN for liquid detergent). Make sure you have used the detergent dispenser according the indications given in this user manual.
The drum light does not go on.	• Make sure that the LED lamp is not burned. To replace it, contact the Authorised Service Centre.

After the check, activate the appliance. The program continues from the point of interruption.

If the problem occurs again, contact the Authorised Service Centre. The necessary data for the service centre are on the rating plate.

13. EMERGENCY DOOR OPENING

In case of power failure or appliance failure the appliance door remains locked. The washing program continues, when the power is restored. If the door remains locked in case of failure, it is possible to open it using the emergency unlock feature.

Before opening the door:



CAUTION!

Make sure that the water temperature and the laundry are not hot. Wait till they cool down, if necessary.



CAUTION!

Make sure that the drum is not rotating. Wait till the drum stops rotating, if necessary.



Make sure that the water level inside the drum is not too high. Proceed with an emergency drain, if necessary (refer to «Emergency drain» in «Care and cleaning» chapter).

To open the door, proceed as follows:

1. Press the button \bigcirc to switch the appliance off.

- 2. Disconnect the mains plug from the mains socket.
- 3. Open the filter flap.
- Pull the emergency unlock trigger downward once. Pull it downward once again, keep it tensed and, in the meanwhile, open the appliance door.



14. WARRANTY

This document sets out the terms and conditions of the product warranties for Electrolux Appliances. It is an important document. Please keep it with your proof of purchase documents in a safe place for future reference should you require service for your Appliance.

- 1. In this warranty:
 - a. 'acceptable quality' as referred to in clause 10 of this warranty has the same meaning referred to in the ACL;
 - b. 'ACL' means Schedule 2 to the Competition and Consumer Act 2010;
 - c. 'Appliance' means any Electrolux product purchased by you and accompanied by this document;
 - d. 'ASC' means Electrolux' authorised serviced centres;
 - e. 'Electrolux' means Electrolux Professional of Level 1, 5-7 Keith Campbell Court, Scoresby, Victoria 3179, ABN 51 004 762 341 in respect of appliances purchased in Australia;
 - f. ¹major failure' as referred to in clause 10 of this warranty has the same meaning referred to in the ACL and includes a situation when an Appliance cannot be repaired or it is un-economic for Electrolux,

- 5. Take out the laundry and then close the appliance door.
- 6. Close the filter flap.

at its discretion, to repair an Appliance during the Warranty Period;

- g. 'Warranty Period' means the Appliance is warranted against manufacturing Defects in Australia for a period of 24 months;
- You' means the purchaser of the Appliance not having purchased the Appliance for re-sale, and 'your' has a corresponding meaning.
- 2. This warranty only applies to Appliances, purchased and used in Australia and is in addition to (and does not exclude, restrict, or modify in any way) any non-excludable statutory warranties in Australia.
- During the Warranty Period Electrolux or its ASC will, at no extra charge if your Appliance is readily accessible for service, without special equipment and subject to these terms and conditions, repair or replace any parts which it considers to be defective. Electrolux or its ASC may use remanufactured parts to repair your Appliance. You agree that any replaced Appliances or parts become the property of Electrolux. This warranty does not apply to light globes, batteries, filters or similar perishable parts.

- 4. Parts and Appliances not supplied by Electrolux are not covered by this warranty.
- 5. To the extent permitted by law, you will bear the cost of transportation, travel and delivery of the Appliance to and from Electrolux or its ASC. If you reside outside of the metropolitan service area, you will bear the cost of:
 - a. travel of an authorised representative;
 - b. transportation and delivery of the Appliance to and from Electrolux or its ASC; In all instances, unless the Appliance is transported by Electrolux or an Electrolux authorised representative, the Appliance is transported at the
 - owner's cost and risk while in transit to and from Electrolux or its ASC.
- 6. Proof of purchase is required before you can make a claim under this warranty.
- You may not make a claim under this warranty unless the defect claimed is due to faulty or defective parts or workmanship. Electrolux is not liable in the following situations (which are not exhaustive):
 - **a**. the Appliance is damaged by:
 - accident
 - misuse or abuse, including failure to properly maintain or service
 - normal wear and tear
 - power surges, electrical storm damage or incorrect power supply
 - incomplete or improper installation
 - incorrect, improper or inappropriate operation
 - insect or vermin infestation
 - failure to comply with any additional instructions supplied with the Appliance;
 - b. the Appliance is modified without authority from Electrolux in writing;
 - c. the Appliance was serviced or repaired by anyone other than the Appliance's serial number or warranty seal has been removed or defaced;

- the Appliance was serviced or repaired by anyone other than Electrolux, an authorised repairer or ASC.
- This warranty, the contract to which it relates and the relationship between you and Electrolux are governed by the law applicable where the Appliance was purchased.
- To the extent permitted by law and subject to your non-excludable statutory rights and warranties, Electrolux excludes all warranties and liabilities (other than as contained in this document) including liability for any loss or damage whether direct or indirect arising from your purchase, use or non use of the Appliance.
- 10. For Appliances and services provided by Electrolux in Australia, the Appliances come with a guarantee by Electrolux that cannot be excluded under the ACL. You are entitled to a replacement or refund for a major failure and for compensation for any other reasonably foreseeable loss or damage. You are also entitled to have the Appliance repaired or replaced if the Appliance fails to be of acceptable quality and the failure does not amount to a major failure. The benefits to you given by this warranty are in addition to your other rights and remedies under a law in relation to the Appliances or services to which the warrantv relates.
- 11. At all times during the Warranty Period, Electrolux shall, at its discretion, determine whether repair, replacement or refund will apply if an Appliance has a valid warranty claim applicable to it.
- 12. To enquire about claiming under this warranty, please follow these steps:
 - a. carefully check the operating instructions, user manual and the terms of this warranty;
 - b. have the model and serial number of the Appliance available;
 - c. have the proof of purchase (eg an invoice) available;
 - d. telephone the numbers shown below.
- 13. You accept that if you make a warranty claim, Electrolux and its ASC

may exchange information in relation to you to enable Electrolux to meet its obligations under this warranty.
